ANDREW MUELLER **Major General, United States Air Force**

Major General Andrew M. Mueller is the Commander, E-3A Component, Geilenkirchen, Germany.

He leads an international military and civilian staff, representing 17 NATO nations which provide an airborne early warning, command and control and battle management capability in support of worldwide and NATO commanders.

General Mueller graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1985. He is a master air battle manager with more than 3,800 hours flying on both U.S. and NATO AWACS aircraft. During his career he has served in various operational and staff positions. The General commanded the 964th Airborne Air Control Squadron, Tinker AFB, Oklahoma, leading the squadron through deployments in support of Operations Southern Watch, Enduring Freedom and Noble Eagle. As Commander of the 505th Training Group, Hurlburt Field, Florida, he was responsible for providing education and training to joint and coalition warfighters on air and space command and control weapons systems and procedures at the operational level of war.



General Mueller has served on the staff of U.S. Pacific Command, where he was responsible for the integration of command and control systems, missile defense, and space operations.

He was Deputy Commander, Combined Air Operations Center 6, Allied Air Forces Southern Europe, Eskisehir, Turkey. The center was responsible for NATO Southern Region air policing, as well as training and preparing defensive and offensive forces to support crisis management actions.

Prior to his current assignment he was assigned as Commander, 81st Training Wing, Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi, where he led and was responsible for 12,000 airmen and civilians, providing technical training for officers, enlisted personnel and civilians of the USAAF, Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve as well as other Department of Defense agencies.
